Privacy statement for ECB Forum on Banking Supervision

What is our legal framework?

All personal data are processed in accordance with EU Data Protection Law, that is to say in line with [Regulation \(EU\) 2018/1725](#) of the European Parliament and of the Council of 23 October 2018 on the protection of natural persons with regard to the processing of personal data by the Union institutions, bodies, offices and agencies and on the free movement of such data, and repealing Regulation (EC) No 45/2001 and Decision No 1247/2002/EC (OJ L 295, 21.11.2018, p. 39).

The data controller is the European Central Bank (ECB).

Why do we process personal data?

The purpose of processing the personal data is the organisation of the ECB Forum on Banking Supervision event: i.e. to register interested persons to the event, contacting and providing participants with information related to the event, provide access to the conference venue, arrange meals, reimbursement of travel and accommodation expenses, where applicable.

What is the legal basis for processing your personal data?

Your personal data are being processed by the ECB:

- because you consent to the processing by providing the personal data requested. You can withdraw your consent at any time by contacting banking.supervision.forum@ecb.europa.eu.

All processing of your personal information will stop once you have withdrawn your consent, but any prior processing will remain lawful.

Who is responsible for processing your personal data?

The ECB is the controller for the processing of the personal data. The ECB's Communications function is responsible for processing the personal data. **The data processor** is the ECB's contractor PP LIVE GmbH (<https://pp-live.com/en>), which supports the ECB with the management of the registrations.

Who will receive your personal data?

The recipients of the data are

- Designated staff of the ECB's Communications function in charge of the organisation of the event;
- Limited number of staff of the ECB 's contractor PP LIVE GmbH and, where necessary, other ECB's contractors involved in the organisation of the event, such as hotels, event agencies and transport service providers.
- The full names of participants/speakers and their function/position/organisation, the speakers' photo and biography will be published on the ECB's website and social media channels (Instagram, YouTube, Twitter and LinkedIn). These data are accessible to the general public.

What type of personal data are collected?

The ECB processes the following personal data:

- Contact data, e.g. full name, organisation, position in the organisation, email address, phone number, nationality, street address, postcode, city and country.

Where are your data transferred, processed, and stored?

Your data are/will be:

- processed by PP LIVE GmbH, located in Germany based on the inclusion of special clauses in the contract with PP LIVE GmbH which ensure that the company complies with EU data protection standards (standard contractual clauses approved by the European Commission).

How long will the ECB keep personal data?

The personal data are stored for a maximum of 3 years after the end of the event before being deleted.

Personal data published on the ECB's website or ECB's social media (Instagram, YouTube, Twitter or LinkedIn) will be retained for as long as the website/social media channels indicate in their privacy policies.

What are your rights?

You have the right to access your personal data and correct any data that is inaccurate or incomplete. You also have (with some limitations) the right to delete your personal data, to object or to restrict the processing of your personal data in line with Regulation (EU) 2018/1725.

Who can you contact in case of queries or requests?

You can exercise your rights by contacting banking.supervision.forum@ecb.europa.eu. You can also directly contact the ECB's Data Protection Officer at dpo@ecb.europa.eu regarding all queries relating to personal data.

Addressing the European Data Protection Supervisor

If you consider that your rights under Regulation (EU) 2018/1725 have been infringed as a result of the processing of your personal data, you have the right to lodge a complaint with the [European Data Protection Supervisor](#) at any time.
